Calls on the State Government to fund a more comprehensive education campaign about the changes to cycling regulations and includes information on sharing the road, shared pathways and footpaths, including recognition of commuters who are at higher risk, including people using mobility aids, people with sensory disabilities, elderly people, young children and those who may be distracted while using technology;
 - V. Calls for this campaign to include education of drivers, cyclists and pedestrians, acknowledging that we are all human beings and that we all have rights and responsibilities to our fellow citizens as we proceed about our daily lives;
 - VI. Calls on all local, State and Federal Government funded road safety initiatives and bodies in South Australia to include education about the new cycling regulations and the diversity of the community using our roads and footpaths; and
 - VII. Calls on creators to ensure any education campaigns are provided in accessible formats including, but not limited to, audio description, captioning, AUSLAN interpretation and Easy English.
